I made my weekend a few years ago at the OH Men's VDC #7. I am retired now and I live in southern Indiana. You asked us to share ways we share our call to action for Christ. I feel that I have a unique opportunity to witness for Christ with many children every year.

I have a long white beard and I wear a red suit as I have been serving as Santa Claus for the last several years at a local photo studio and at several elementary schools in this area. I usually see about 900 to 1100 children every year and some of them for multiple years. Here's one thing I try to always do. When they have been to visit Santa or have had their picture made with Santa and are ready to leave I always remind each of them that <u>Jesus is the Reason for the Season</u>. I tell them that Christmas is the celebration of the birth of our Savior and not just a time to see how many gifts they can get. Almost all of the children are open and want to learn about Jesus and it only takes a moment to tell them.

A Message from our Spiritual Director

The Lenten season begins February 18, which is Ash Wednesday. Lent is six weeks, not counting Sundays and ends with the celebration of Easter.

That reminds me of a story. A man died and appeared before St. Peter. Apparently he had not been all that regular in attending worship. So St. Peter said, "Let me ask you some questions. One question was, "What is Lent?" The man thought for a moment and blurted, "Oh, I know that one. Lent is when Jesus comes out of the tomb and if he sees his shadow, there will be six more weeks of Lent."

Seriously, Lent is a time for us to pray, meditate, and reflect on the events that led to the crucifixion of Jesus. There are special days such as Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday on which we gather for worship. Many congregations set aside time for mid-week Lenten services that center on specific aspects of the Passion.

Lent is a good time for us to connect more intentionally with Christ and the church. It can be a time for us to give more of ourselves simply to be in the presence of Jesus.

Remember, it is when the groundhog sees his shadow there will be six more weeks of Lent. May you take the time to have a blessed Lent.

KAIROS PRISON MINISTRY INTERNATIONAL

Kairos is an outgrowth of the Cursillo, Via de Cristo, and other similar movements. In 1975 there was a meeting, held in Atlanta, of Cursillo leaders from several denominations, although it was heavily Lutheran. One participant was a man named Tom Johnson, a Roman Catholic from Florida who had been thinking of taking the Cursillo weekend to prison. Another participant was Gene Hermeier, a Lutheran pastor from Iowa, who was planning a prison weekend that fall. He invited Tom to come to the weekend, which he did. Tom then organized a Kairos weekend at the Union Correctional Institute of Florida in the fall of 1976. This weekend is considered to be the beginning of Kairos. Kairos has now grown to be active in 37 states and 9 foreign countries, with thousands of volunteers across the globe.

The purpose of the Kairos weekend is to build Christian communities within prison walls. For that reason, early weekends were held only in prisons where the residents (which is what the inmates are called in Kairos) would be incarcerated for longer periods of time.

Kairos is called a ministry because it is bringing the gospel of God's love to persons who may or may not have any prior knowledge of Christ or the Church. It is not a ministry of conversion in that no one is asked to make a decision for Christ. The purpose, instead, is to bring God's love into the prison and let the Holy Spirit do the rest. That does not mean that some residents don't have conversion experiences on the weekend, but that is not the purpose of the weekend. As with Via de Cristo, the primary reason for the weekend is to create Prayer and Share groups, but within the prison walls. These groups have the same purpose as Reunion Groups, which is to support one another in living Christ-like lives in their environments in the Fourth Day.

Over the years the Kairos Inside (prison) weekend format has been changed to better reflect the needs of the residents. For instance, the Ideal talk is now Choices. The residents know that they have made bad choices in their lives—in fact that is why they are incarcerated. There is general agape (palanca) and personal agape. They learn that God wants a relationship with them and wants them to share this with others in their environment. Several key phrases are also taught, for instance, "We are the Church" and "Make a friend, be a friend, bring that friend to Christ". Forgiveness is an important part of the weekend. Saturday evening there is a Forgiveness Service in which the residents put the list of people they need to forgive in a bowl of water or a fire and watch the list disappear. The closing is similar to the VDC closings, and those who want to attend fill out a Closing Application and a background check is done by the institution. Some prisons have the Closing Application on line at Kairos Ohio.org. This has been a very successful ministry. The rate of Kairos graduates reoffending is statically less than those who have not participated in a weekend, even if all they did was attend the weekend. The more active the person was in Kairos activities, the lower the rate of returning to prison. Those of us who have been active in Kairos have seen lives change. I am now on FaceBook with a number of Kairos graduates who are back in the community and doing well, and that is a joy. Kairos is a positive, successful, fulfilling ministry. After only one weekend at the Ohio Reformatory for Women, Warden Money said, "This is the most effective program we have ever had in this institution."

There are two other Kairos programs: Kairos Outside and Torch. Kairos Outside is for the female relatives or support persons of those who are incarcerated or who have been incarcerated. One Kairos Outside in Ohio is inside Marion Correctional for the female support persons of Kairos grads in that prison. The other is Kairos Outside Community that is open to support persons for inmates from any prison in the state. I participated in a Kairos Outside weekends also and saw lives changed through this ministry. Torch is a program for juvenile offenders that includes a six month mentoring program. This is also active in Ohio.

Kairos Inside is now in 28 prisons in Ohio. Governor Kasich would like Kairos in every institution in the state because it is so successful reducing reincarceration. This is not possible because there are not enough volunteers. I encourage you to join a Kairos Inside, Kairos Outside or Torch team and see for yourselves what a blessing it is to be a Kairos volunteer.

A Message from VdC Ohio Music Advisor Jen Briner

Graham Kendrick, the author of "Shine Jesus Shine" (a.k.a. Lord the Light of Your Love), is a British singer/songwriter whose work began in the late 1960's. Together with two friends, he started the "March for Jesus" movement in 1987, which is an interdenominational event in which Christians gather together to march though several towns and cities. (Last US walk was in 2000 but this continues still in many other countries.) It was also in 1987 that Graham wrote "Shine Jesus Shine". He wrote the song as a prayer for revival. The following is from his website, describing the circumstances behind the writing of the song.

"I had been thinking for some time about the holiness of God, and how that as a community of believers and as individuals, His desire is for us to live continually in his presence. My longing for revival in the Churches and spiritual awakening in the nation was growing, but also a recognition that we cannot stand in God's presence without 'clean hands and a pure heart'. So I wrote the three verses and 'road tested' it in my home church. Though there was clearly merit to the song, it seemed incomplete, so as I was unable at the time to take it any further, I put it back in the file. Several months later I was asked to submit new songs for a conference songbook, and as I reviewed this three verse song I realized that it needed a chorus. I remember standing in my music room with guitar slung round my neck trying different approaches. The line 'Shine Jesus Shine' came to mind, and within about half an hour I had finished the chorus, all but some 'polishing'. Though I felt an excitement in my spirit at the time, I had no inkling at all that it would become so widely used!"

Kendrick still lives in the UK and "Shine Jesus Shine" continues to be his most well-known and loved work.
