The Weekend is at the retreat center at Camp Otyokwah, a Christian event and retreat center located near Butler, OH (and about 7 miles from Bellville). It's at 3380 Tugend Road, Butler, 44822, 419-883-3854, info@otyokwah.org. To get there from I 71, use Bellville exit 165 for St. Rt. 97. Follow 97 east through Bellville, continue on through Butler, going about 1.5 mi. to Benedict Rd. and turn right at the sign for "Otyokwah". Go on Benedict about 1.5 mi. to Tugend Road, turning left at the sign for "Otyokwah" and continue 1.6 mi. to the camp.

The Clausura (Closing) will be held on Sunday, April 30, at St. Paul Lutheran at 48 Church Street in Bellville. Look for an update to the Newsletter in a few days with the time schedule for all the events of CE2 as well as open places on the 72 hour Prayer Palanca.

The best Palanca you can give is your prayers, but as you remember from your Weekend, Palanca items are always nice too. If you have letters for the Pilgrims and/or Team (handwritten is especially nice) or other items for them, please give them to a Team member before the Weekend if you can. You may also bring them when you come to Sendoff (Thursday) or Serenade (Saturday). A Message from our VdCOhio Spiritual Director

In triumph we declare on Easter morning, "Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed!" Easter is why we can gather unashamedly and shout what we believe God has done for Jesus and what He has promised to do for us. The scriptures remind us, "God is the God of the living, not the dead."

Comedian Bill Maher sometimes has a segment on his TV show "Real Time with Bill Maher". 'I can't prove it. I just know it's true'. Easter faith is a bit like that. We believe Christ was raised from the dead even though we can't prove it. We just know it's true that Easter Faith is a gift to us through the work of the Holy Spirit.

The first witnesses at the empty tomb didn't really know what to believe, not until Christ appeared to Mary and called her name, not until He came to the Apostles in a locked room where they huddled in fear. Then He said "Peace be with you."

We believe largely because of the witnesses to the Resurrection. We become those who believe even though we have not yet seen. A spoken beatitude to Thomas who declared he would not believe until he could see Jesus himself.

The promise and the faith at Easter is: Life is stranger than death; Love is greater than hate; Mercy overcomes judgement; the sufferings and difficulties of this life are temporary. The last word pronounced by God is new life, eternal life through Jesus Christ. That is our Easter faith.

So with all the faith and confidence we can muster we go to worship on Easter and shout with fellow believers, "Christ is Risen! He is Risen indeed!" Remember as we sing in VdC, "Every Morning is Easter morning from now on."
