

A Message from VdC National Spiritual Director

I pray this finds you still filled with joy and hope after just having lived through another Resurrection Day. I pray that your day spent in worship and with family and friends will carry through today and every day this week. But here's what I know: we're back at work... we're back at school... we're back to our daily routines and Easter's event, though grand and spectacular, is going to have to stay there because we have things to do... places to go... people to see... and we have no time to waste. Oh, we won't forget about the Resurrection, but it won't be the highlight as it was that Sunday.

Today, in my Bible reading, I was reading of Joshua taking the people of Israel over the Jordan River to get to Jericho and the Promised Land (Joshua 3-5). What caught my eye, and made my mind spin, was God telling Joshua to take a man from each of the 12 tribes of Israel and have them pick up a boulder from the middle of the Jordan River and bring it with them to shore. Then they were to set them up, one of top of the other, and make a memorial. And here's what Joshua said to them...

"Let this be a sign among you, so that when your children ask later, saying, 'What do these stones mean to you?' then you shall say to them, 'Because the waters of the Jordan were cut off before the ark of the covenant of the LORD... these stones shall become a memorial to the sons of Israel forever." Joshua 4:6-7

That heap of stones was to be a talk piece for family and friends as they were reminded of the great things God had done for them as they entered the Promised Land.

Well, it seems to me that we might not have a heap of stones to talk about, but we certainly have a stone to talk about after Easter's events. You know, that big one that was rolled in front of Jesus' tomb and sealed, with soldiers stationed around it to keep anyone from stealing the body of Jesus. Ya, that stone!

That stone which took quite a few men to put into place but only One to move it aside. That stone that protected the Lord's body for three days. That stone that obeyed it's Creator's voice and made way for the coming out of the Risen King.

You see, Resurrection Day is not over. It should never be over in our lives. We should still be talking about it. If we don't, I know another group of stones that will - they will cry out.

Here's my word of encouragement for you today: Resurrection Day is only over if you want it to be over. But it is the greatest day in history. It's why you can celebrate. Jesus is not here! He has risen! Who you going to tell?

Father,

Don't allow me to keep the Resurrection of my Savior all to myself - they stone reminds me of that. Jesus in Your name I ask this, Amen.

The second thing is the upcoming Co-ed Weekend. There are opportunities to be involved. There is Prayer Palanca, money Palanca (to help cover the cost for the weekend), Send off, Serenade and the Closing. Look elsewhere in the newsletter for this information as for times or contacts.

A Message from Pr. Gaston, VdC Ohio Spiritual Director

As I get older it seems like I have a lot more questions than I do answers. I have a feeling that I am not alone with that. When it comes to matters of faith, it is often a tension between what I know for sure and what seems to be categorized by the thought, "it seems to be too good to be true."

On Easter morning, Peter, James, John, the two Marys, and all the other disciples were filled with confusion, despair, fear, grief, and oh so many questions about what just happened in the past week and in particular what had taken place on Friday, Saturday, and then Sunday. What did it all mean? What will happen next? Oh so many questions. They just didn't know what to make of it.

Faith often feels fragile and very uncertain. We need a lot of reassuring about what to believe and whom to trust. It helps to know others believe what we do. It helps to have other people of faith walk alongside of us through this journey of life. Our faith is renewed when we worship together, pray together, serve together. We share our faith stories as we live in Christian community.

Our pastor told us on Easter Sunday that we might have our own doubts wondering whether the Resurrection was real. He said that in that way we are not all that different from those first witnesses on Easter morning. He suggested that we take some quiet time to read the Gospel accounts again and then reflect and observe the ways we see God working in our lives today. Perhaps that way we may become aware of Christ's presence with us.

One of my favorite Easter stories is the one when Jesus walked along with two disciples on their way to Emmaus. They didn't know it was Jesus. After all what they knew was that Jesus died on Friday. Jesus talked with them about all that had taken place. He opened the scriptures to them trying to help them understand what had happened.

When they arrived in Emmaus the two disciples invited Jesus to stay with them for the night. As they were gathered for the evening meal Jesus prayed and suddenly they recognized who this stranger was. Jesus was not dead. He was alive. Their faith was renewed and restored.

In VDC we have many opportunities to share our life stories of faith with each other. Whether as a pilgrim, or serving on a weekend team, attending an Ulterya, or meeting with a reunion brother or sister we help build each other up in the faith. In those ways we are drawn closer to the Risen Christ and to each other. We still may have many more questions than answers but together we can discover all the faith we need.
