Clergy Experience #2 will be Monday – Thursday, October 5 – 8, 2015 at St. Peter and Paul Retreat Center. Rector Chuck Fahnestock writes:

I believe the Clergy Experience has incredible potential. Butch and I attended all three Ohio ELCA Synod Assemblies and we were able to speak to a large number of clergy and congregation delegates. Three big discussion points were revealed over and over: 1) Almost all the laypeople and a majority of clergy had no knowledge of Via de Cristo or cursillo programs, 2) Many clergy who had heard of Via de Cristo but not experienced a cursillo program had doubts, concerns, or misunderstandings about the program, and 3) most of the people we spoke with, both clergy and lay, after hearing the purpose and format of VdC, wanted to learn more.

I had one retired pastor say to me, "I wish I would have known about VdC when I was serving. Why would anyone pass up the opportunity to experience this?"

There are congregations all over the state looking for the kind of spark that VdC can bring to their ministry. I hope you can help make Clergy #2 the grace filled experience that makes our clergy say, "I wish I would have known about this sooner. Why would anyone want to pass up this experience?"

So <u>how</u> can <u>you</u> help? Speak to your pastor and other pastors you know—Lutheran or another denomination—and see what they know of VdC. Tell them what you know about Via de Cristo, its purpose and content and format, and tell them about the date of Clergy Experience #2. Give their names and addresses to Lay Director Butch Seeley (see contact info on p. 1) who will send them further information. Clergy people do not need "Sponsors" but may register themselves to attend.

As always, provide the Palanca of your prayer.

"Blessed Be the Name of the Lord" is one of the newer songs which was introduced into the Via de Cristo songbook during the last update. It was written by Matt and Beth Redman in 2011 in response to the events that unfolded on 9/11.

They noticed in the weeks to follow the brokenness that was everywhere and that many were seeking comfort in the church. In the weeks following 9/11, church attendance in America went up dramatically. During their visiting of many congregations and hearing many powerful sermons, the Redmans began to wonder where the songwriters were in a time like this? There were no appropriate songs to adequately express pain and lament. Sometimes, the Church of God needs her songs of lament just as much as she needs her songs of victory. "Blessed Be the Name of the Lord" is not a song that was consciously written in response to those dark events but a song born out of the whole of life, a realization that we will all face seasons of pain or unease. In these seasons we will need to find our voice of lament before God.

This song was first sung on a women's weekend when I chose it to be my Rollo song. My life has been both "In the land that is plentiful, where Your streams of abundance flow" and "In the desert place though I walk through the wilderness" but, as the Bible says in Job 2, "Shall we indeed expect good from God and not adversity?" It is only through the power and grace of Jesus Christ that I can still say "Blessed be the name of the Lord"! And you can too.

Do not be afraid. Where have you heard that before? Ask your sponsor or a friend to attend a local Ultreya with you. Jackie and I have invited many to attend an Ultreya before they have even gone on a weekend. They get to experience the environment of a weekend; some then made weekends and others did not. It did not hurt to invite them to come and see.

If there are no Ultreyas in your area, please talk to someone on Secretariat and we can help you get one started at your place of worship. They are not meant to be inclusive of only your church, but open to the whole Christian community beyond your church, VdC veterans and others. HOW TO PUT AN ULTREYA TOGETHER

- 1. Pray! For the Ultreya, about whom to call, for God's blessing.
- 2. Read the Ultreya article from the National Lutheran Secretariat. (Call Donna Gough)
- 3. Call the following individuals to be part of the Ultreya:
 - A. MC or Moderator. Should be someone who can speak well. MC will keep time on track, operate from Schedule (sample attached).
 - B. Musician or Musicians. Plan and play for the Ultreya. Prepare a song sheet or provide song books.
 - C. Lay Speaker. To talk about what the Lord is doing in their life, for about 10 minutes. Provide with Ultreya speaker guidelines.
 - D. Spiritual Director. To tie the lay witness talk to the Gospel, and provide Holy Communion.
- 4. As far in advance as possible, arrange publicity within the congregation, in OhioVDC, and within your Area. If e-mail addresses are not available, ask Nancy Martin to send the announcement to the entire state. Just provide her with details of YOUR Ultreya
- 5. Arrange for setup of location (chairs, podium, Holy Communion, snack table, handout table.
- 6. Provide the following handouts:
 - A. Songsheets or song books (see Musician above)
 - B. Announcements of upcoming events (if known)
 - C. Weekend Pilgrim and Sponsor applications. (Download from OhioVDC website)
 - D. Leaders' School applications (Download from OhioVDC website)
 - E. Temporary Nametags.
- 7. Ask everyone to bring a snack to share, but arrange for beverages.
- 8. Arrange for the Ultreya team to arrive early for prayer and to set up site.
- 9. Arrange for or clean up site afterwards.
- 10. Write a short article for the next Newsletter to encourage attendance at the next Ultreya!

What is palanca? What is a palanca letter? A palanca letter is one that is sent to the PILGRIMS and team, informing them of the prayers, affection and sacrifices that you are offering to God on their behalf. A letter may be sent explaining what type of palanca is being offered, but the letter is NOT the palanca. The actual palanca is the action - intercessory prayer, sacrifice, or works of mercy or love, and it can be done without writing a letter. But letters are good!

Prior to VdC of Ohio Clergy Experience #2 and for the Co-Ed Weekend, you will have an opportunity to be part of the 72-hour Prayer Palancas. You are invited to prepare other Palanca items if you like.

My Faith Story - My Journey:

On July 25, 2009 at 7:38 p.m., my life made a very dramatic change -- and this day, July 25, 2015 marks the 6th year anniversary of that change.

I found DC Patterson, my husand of 20 years, 3 months, 19 hours and 38 minutes lying on the floor of the office in our house at 483 Marion Cardington Road West, Marion, Ohio. I went in and began talking to Denny and touching him to get his attention, but there was no response. All that day DC was sleeping in the chair in the living room, where he usually can sleep, since he felt unable to breathe lying down in bed for a number of years.

The day before DC had a doctor appointment with his VA doctor and we were both so thrilled when he told me that his blood pressure was the best it had ever been in months, perhaps even years. However, that night he was unable to sleep in the chair and so the next day we spent, just two of us watching movies and DC kept dozing off in the chair. Late in the afternoon DC went into the office to play his Freecell game on the computer.

Close to dinnertime, DC was just sitting in front of the computer with a blackened screen, still dozing. I said that I was going to the grocery to pick something up for dinner. We said our usual goodbyes: I love you more - No, I love you more! When I returned home, I put groceries away and went to check on DC in the office and found him lying on his right side from falling off the chair onto the floor.

I kept trying to get him to speak to me and touching and shaking him to wake up and then I just sat down on the floor beside him and leaned against the wall, looked up and prayed to God to bring him back to me - but of course, God couldn't do that - for God had called him home at 7: 38 p.m., Saturday, July 25th, of 2009.

The only thing I could do then was to call 911 and Harley and Mary Page next door, who had become our second parents, always there to help us in any way they could, just as we were there to help them in their needs as well.

The medics checked DC for any signs of life, saying they heard a shallow breathing; at first I thought there was some hope. They took him to Marion General hospital, and I knew by that time that shallow breathing means nothing more than God had him in His comforting arms and DC's body was gone.

I didn't want to leave the hospital without DC, but I kissed him goodbye - and I knew that he knew how much I loved him! He was watching me from heaven, standing beside Jesus! Seeing Denny where he was NOW - I knew that I had to find a way to continue on in this new Journey where God had placed me and I remembered what Denny once said to me in a letter while we were courting - "Sherry, I love watching you grow!"

In the "Jesus Calling" devotional for July 25th, God is saying to me six years to this day: "As you listen to birds calling to one another, hear also My love-call to you. I speak to you continually: through sights, sounds, thoughts, impressions, scriptures. There is no limit to the variety of ways I can communicate with you. Your part is to be attentive to My messages, in whatever form they come. When you set out to find Me in a day, you discover that the world is vibrantly alive with My Presence. You can find Me not only in beauty and birdcalls, but also in tragedy and faces filled with grief. I can take the deepest sorrow and weave it into a pattern for good. Search for Me and My messages, as you go through this day. You will seek Me and find Me when you seek Me with your whole being."

I'm reading a book by Thomas Merton, <u>Dialogues with Silence</u>. This spoke to me in particular: "Not to know where his life was going was always to begin again in Merton's journey to love learning and desire God." I have found myself here in recent months: A "thin place" as Merton describes it, between night and the edge of light that signals dawn. As Pastor Al Sager described it in one of his articles etched in my memory, "Thin places" has its home in a particular way of thinking about God. I have been seeing God as not somewhere else, but "right here," sitting, walking, standing beside me, wherever I am! God is closer than the air we breathe ... God is the air we breathe! He's given us a message through Paul in Philippians 4:9, Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you!
