I thought about what information a non- Christian person may be able to find regarding the season of Lent. So, hey, I Goggled it...and pulled a definition of Lent off the internet and here is one I found from BBC-Religions-Christianity: Lent

Beginning on Ash Wednesday, **Lent** is a season of reflection and preparation before the **celebrations** of Easter. By observing the 40 days of **Lent**, Christians replicate Jesus Christ's sacrifice and withdrawal into the desert for 40 days. **Lent** is marked by fasting, both from food and festivities.

For us disciples of Jesus Christ we don't need to google it. We know we observe it out of reverence for our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. We want to follow Jesus. God's grace is given freely and we can't earn our way, nor do we need to observe certain practices to get to heaven.

But nevertheless, we want to follow Jesus.

The Via de Cristo, provides a methodology to follow Jesus. There are other methods that disciples use which are successful; Via de Cristo is one which is available to the lay person and Clergy alike. It does bear fruit.

I was reminded of the perseverance tools the ministry provides through Group Reunion and Ultreya. Through Group Reunion we share our walk with Jesus. We share our Piety, Study, and Action.

We commit to an "Apostolic Plan-Grow as a Christian-Plan Ahead!" An Apostolic Plan is defined in the Pilgrim's Guide as "any endeavor which brings someone closer to a life in union with Christ!"

We are asked: "What are you planning for next week? Piety? Study? Action?"

"And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds. Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another--and all the more as you see the day approaching

(Hebrews 10:24-25 NIV)

The world needs Christ, the world needs encouragement, we as believers need it too.

Help Wanted

Below are just a few opportunities available to get more involved, but if you have other ideas that we should consider, please let us know about those as well.

- Lay Director: Our current Lay Director, Warren "Butch" Seeley will end his final term as our coach and leader at our Annual Meeting on June 23. Some of the duties of the Lay Director include: presiding over all meetings of the Secretariat, being an ex-officio member of all committees (except the nominating committee), appointing non-elected members of the Secretariat, preparing and presenting reports for the VdC-OH membership as well as to the National Lutheran Secretariat.
- Secretary: Kevin Hoch's first term as Secretary of the Secretariat will end in June. The Secretary's duties include keeping minutes of all meetings of the Membership and Secretariat and maintaining all archived records of the organization.
- Tech Media Assistants: The Tech Media Specialist is currently responsible for all the areas listed below and is need of assistants to help maintain each area as indicated. Although strongly encouraged, these assistants would not be required to attend Secretariat meetings and would be under the direction of the Tech Media Specialist. There could be an assistant for each area or one assistant to help cover all areas.
 - **Web-site:** Work directly with the Web-site developer to make updates to the Web-site as requested, regularly update the Web-site calendar, and keep the Secretariat apprised of Web-site traffic and current best-practices.
 - Social Media:
 - Archives: Work under the Secretary to maintain the membership book of Via de Cristo as well as archive weekend rosters and photos. (Microsoft Excel experience highly recommended)
- **Regional/Church Representatives**: These individuals would be the Secretariat's local presence in their churches or geographical regions. Again, although strongly encouraged, these representatives would not be required to attend Secretariat meetings but would need to be in consistent communication with the 4th Day Shepherd and/or Secretariat Palanca Cha.

A Message from VdC-Ohio Spiritual Director

With some irony, Lent 2018 began on Valentine's Day, February 14th and ends with the celebration of Easter on April 1 (Fool's Day). Valentine's Day celebrates romantic love. That same day is Ash Wednesday reminding us of our mortality on this planet. Burnt ashes from the previous year's Palm Sunday are marked on our foreheads in the form of a cross. The sobering words are spoken to us, "you are dust and to dust you shall return."

The Lenten Season is 40 days not counting Sundays. Forty is an important number in the Bible. Noah, his family, and all those animals were on the Ark while it rained 40 days and 40 nights, destroying everything in its path. God prepared them for a new beginning. After escaping Egyptian slavery, the Israelites spent 40 years in the wilderness before they were permitted to enter the Promised Land. Years of preparation they were. After his Baptism, Jesus was led into the wilderness where he faced temptations from Satan. Days of preparation for his journey to the cross.

The 40 days of Lent are meant to be a period of spiritual preparation for us. We ready ourselves spiritually to more fully appreciate what Easter and the Resurrection means for us. Lent is not an end but a new beginning that points us to a new day that brings new life, that life that has no end.

Through his life, death and resurrection we learn who God has created us to be.
