**How weekends are held:** considering essentials, the adiaphorous, anemic Fourth Day activity, Team calling and preparation, lack of consistent Community support, etc.

Both are equally important; without one, the other ceases to exist as a concern.

This is a call to action! My credo as Lay Director is: "A LOT MORE TALK, AND A LOT MORE ACTION!" Prayer, Prayer, Prayer, and action empowered by the Holy Spirit.

#### A Message from Spiritual Director Pastor G. Karl Gaston

(as presented to the VdC Annual Meeting on February 1, 2014)

#### Knowing Grace/Living Grace

I have been thinking and praying about what to say to you today.

One of the things I've noticed about after dinner speakers is often times they will warm up the audience with some jokes. Here is my attempt.

Lutherans are conditioned by certain liturgical responses. The pastor says a certain phrase and the congregation responds without missing a beat. One Sunday the sound system was not working properly. So the first words out of the Pastor's mouth were "There's something wrong with the microphone." The congregation responded "And also with you"

A child was saying her goodnight prayers. She concluded..."Bless mommy and daddy...And dear God, take good care of yourself, for if anything happens to you we are all sunk. Amen."

Okay, now that has been taken care of let me share with you what's been rolling around in my head lately.

A few months back I was watching "Morning Joe" on MSNBC. They were doing a rare religious segment. The guest was talking about a book which he had written. The title of the book is <u>One Way Love</u>. The sub-title is "Inexhaustible Grace For An Exhausted World". He sounded very Lutheran. Then I heard him say he was Billy Graham's grandson, but his last name was not Graham. His name: Tullian Tehividyian. Well, I had Jeanne download the book on my Nook and read it immediately.

I couldn't put it down. The more I read the more I thought he must have gone to a Lutheran Seminary or maybe even been a Lutheran pastor. I wondered how that could happen in the Graham family. I discovered that he is Senior Pastor of Coral Ridge Presbyterian Church in Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

Much of what I'm going to say to you today will be based on what I read in One Way Love.

I have come to love the Via de Cristo movement. I believe it is what it says it is: "a brief course in Christianity." I have talked with so many who have attended a Weekend and have had a life-changing transformation of faith. A familiar report is, "Now I know what grace is" because they experienced it on the Weekend.

Yes, grace is at the heart of who we are and how we understand faith as Lutherans. Of course that doesn't mean we are the only ones in the Church who understand grace. But it was a core concept for Martin Luther as he echoed the scriptures, "We are saved by grace through faith in Jesus Christ apart from works of the Law."

I believe it is vital and essential for us to know what grace is and then to incorporate that grace into our daily living. Knowing grace and living grace is to inform our relationship with God and with our neighbor.

Tullian wrote "We live in an exhausted world." You know, I felt exhausted just reading about that. Just check out various polls that tell us what people are feeling and concerned about. A majority of people in our country feel like we are moving in the wrong direction. Incomes for the middle class are stagnant. People are worried about the present and pessimistic about the future.

People are living with too much guilt, too much stress, too much uncertainty in daily life. We live in a world that lives under what we call, spiritually, the Law. The Law is conditional. If you do this, that will happen. You do something for me, then I will do something for you. The Law is the opposite to grace. The dynamic works like this:

If he Law is the first word, then Grace is the last word.

If the Law exposes, then Grace exonerates.

If the Law disguises, Grace delivers.

If the Law accuses, Grace acquits.

If the Law condemns, Grace saves.

The Law says you're cursed. Grace says you're blessed.

The Law says you're alone. Grace says God is with you.

The Law says you're not good enough. Grace says your accepted, forgiven, and have new life.

Paul Zahl wrote, "Grace is love that seeks you out when you have nothing to give in return."

Robert Capon wrote," Grace works without requiring anything on our part. It's not expensive. It's not even cheap. It's free."

Definition: Grace is an unconditional acceptance by an unobligated giver. It's one way love.

Wow!! Grace feels sooo good when we are receiving it. The problem is, not understanding what grace is. The problem is, how do I live the grace we have received when it comes to relationships in my life.

That is the question that I've been living with for some time now. Like the Liberty Mutual commercials. We live in this world with other human beings. We make a lot of mistakes, often times without even realizing it.

A few Sundays ago in my sermon I latched on to an exercise to share with the congregation. I had the people write down this: "I am a child of God

Deserving of love and respect

God will use me today to change the world."

The instruction was to look in the mirror when you first get up in the morning and say that.

"I am a child of God." That defines who we are. It's what our Baptism tells us.

"Deserving of love and respect." That comes from God's grace.

"To change the world." That defines our purpose for living. Love God. Love your neighbor. It's that simple.

We can live grace when we believe that Emmanuel God is with us.

When we believe Nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus When we recognize each day involves dying to sin and rising to new life with Christ When we hear the words of Jesus "Neither do I condemn you. Go and sin no more"

There are no ifs, ands or buts about God's grace – Knowing God's grace/living with God's grace.

# Ohio Via de Cristo Five Year Strategic Plan

Create and communicate a clear vision and mission statement.

Work closely with all available resources, National Lutheran Secretariat, Regional Outreach Coordinator-Mark Carson, etc.

Put Constitution and Bylaws in place.

Once the Strategic Plan is adopted by the Secretariat, it should be reviewed and monitored for progress/accomplishment.

Transparent communication to the community by all means possible.

#### **TECHNOLOGY**

Appoint a Technology Team (3-7 people) to embrace and bring the movement to appropriate technological advances, Graphic Design.

- 1). Presentations at the weekends, Road shows, Leadership school, power point, etc.
- 2). Pod casts, Skype, webinars, etc.
- 3). Social Media, Facebook, twitter, etc.
- 4). Website enhancement, maintenance, links, etc.
- 5). Smart phone technology, apps, text, notifications, etc.
- 6). Community bulletin board, "looking for a group", ultreyas, etc.
- 7). Establish easy sponsorship template on line.

#### **cOACHING Efforts**


- 1). Seven co-coaches in place with state divided into seven areas.
- 2). Clearly defined roles and responsibilities for the seven co-coaches.
- 3). A minimum of seven informational luncheons for Pastors, at least one in each area per year.
- 4). A minimum of forty-nine church visits, at least seven in each area per year.
- 5). Co-coaches to provide leadership and correct data regarding Groups and Ultreya in their assigned areas.
- 6). Establish a firm Ultreya in each of the seven areas.
- 7). Establish fruitful relationships with synods, Bishops, ELCA, NALC, etc.

#### **WEEKENDS**

- 1). Establish clear unwavering guidelines for the minimum Pilgrims that will be required to have a Weekend.
- 2). Establish a waiting list procedure for Weekend attendance; we prefer this to deferring attendance.
- 3). Establish clear and unwavering criteria for being called to work on a team.
- 4). Appoint a task force to locate back up locations for Weekends, Grand Ultreyas, Leadership Schools, etc.
- 5). Consider embracing technology on the Weekends as appropriate.
- 6). Consider Congregational sponsorship of a particular Weekend.

#### **FINANCIAL**

- 1). Establish an on-going gift strategy for the movement.
- 2). Establish a long-term Estate gifting program.
- 3). Seek out grants from foundations for some of the strategies that will require funding.
- 4). Consider some appropriate partnerships with Christian businesses to generate revenue, directory-web advertisers?

# Mission Focus for co-coaches

- Join the Secretariat in corporate prayer for the Via de Cristo of Ohio the second Tuesday of every month from 7-7:30 PM.
- Work in your assigned area to tactfully foster awareness of the Via de Cristo.
- Call on churches within your assigned area to explore the opportunity to introduce Via de Cristo to the Pastor(s) and Congregation(s).
- Be liaisons between the Pastors, Community, and Churches with the Secretariat; be eyes and ears for the Secretariat.
- Attend and assist in the organization of Ultrevas and compile data: (who, where and when).
- Gather data of Group reunions: (who, where, and when).
- Attend coffee hours or other opportunities as presented by Christians to provide information about Via de Cristo.
- Assist in the distribution of Via de Cristo informational pieces to people in your assigned area.
- Attend Send off, Closing, Serenade, and encourage the Community to do the same.
- Assist in the enhancement of transparent communication with the Community by all means possible.
- Attend the Pastors' Informational Luncheons when scheduled in your area.
- Take a Pastor out to lunch once in a while whether they have attended a weekend or not.
- Support the commitment to focus on Weekends, Group, and Ultreya equally.
- Follow up with new Cursillistas after they attend a weekend to help them find a group and encourage Ultreya attendance.
- Attend a conference call or Skype session with the entire coaching staff at a mutually convenient time quarterly.


