Ohio Via de Cristo Spiritual Director Doug Pretorius

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Great grace and abundant peace be with you all.

The great lie that is promoted by our society is that we are independent and can do it all by ourselves. We Americans love the story of the penniless orphan who rises above the tragic circumstances of life to pull himself up by his bootstraps – to use the phrase that conveys the essence of this myth – to become a successful businessman, a devoted family man, and a great community leader. The female version of this myth has a spin off that says a woman can be a mother, career professional, and not even need a man.

The most powerful of lies work because they contain a strong mixture of truth. Indeed we do not have to look far to find people who have overcome great adversity to become successful, no matter how you define successful. There is within us a tremendous capacity to do more and be more than we realize. We need to hear the word "You are not defined by your circumstances," but we need to root out the lie "You can do it alone."

On a Via de Cristo weekend we are reminded that God calls us to be in a relationship of dependence upon him so that we can live the abundant life promised by Jesus. Living apart from God leads to disaster and so we are invited to pay attention to the practices that keep us connected to God: practices of being in relationship – piety; practices of hearing God speak – study; and practices of doing the work for which God created us — apostolic action. However, the deeper lie that can seduce us is, "Now that you have God, you and God alone can do it all."

This is precisely the reason we need each other, and this is the reason that the Via de Cristo method stresses reunion groups. Others can see the lies that we tell ourselves easier than we can see it ourselves. In our quest to live according to the truth we need the insight and wisdom of others to discern truth and lies. And they need our ability to see what is really happening in their lives.

None of this can happen, however, if we are not safe, if the group is not practicing rigorous honesty, absolute confidentiality, complete vulnerability, and – most important of all – total loving, grace-filled acceptance of each other. Rare is the group that practices this. It requires hard work and focused attention to move beyond the superficialities, to risk being hurt – again, to engage in the struggle to know ourselves and to know God, and to live in trust. Because humans have failed us in the past, it is difficult to trust that another human being can hold in safety our most precious secrets, our deepest fears, and our impossible dreams.

But God can. The glory of God is that he risked everything in becoming mortal with all the limitations, weaknesses, challenges, and difficulties involved in being human. Then with the power of the Holy Spirit within him, Jesus lived out life that is really living. And he did not do it alone. He entrusted himself to three men who knew him intimately, to twelve men who heard his most private thoughts, and to seventy men and women who received his most intensive teachings and his call to action.

If Jesus was a part of a "reunion group" consisting of Peter, James, John and himself, dare we risk not following the same pattern? We have seen from the Scriptures what the result of living in so connected a community did for them. The three disciples were utterly transformed. Jesus completed the action God chose for him to do. Allow God, through your reunion group, to bring you the freedom, the power, and the life that flows from living the truth.

The mountaintop experience doesn't always occur each time we meet but the reunion group keeps me near the mountain. The group and meeting place has changed many times over the years but the support and blessings continue to grow and bless me. The Holy Spirit can and does work through my brothers and that is why I look forward to again working on a weekend. He has called a group of us together to "do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with our God", and by the grace of God and your prayer support we will be the conduits that help Him carry out His great plan of bringing all of creation back to Him (Eph 1:10). Without Christ we can do nothing but with Him we can do all things. Remembering the words of commissioning during the weekend "Christ is counting on us," we go forward into this weekend to glorify Him. Please pray without ceasing that we stay focused and humble.

WOW! AND DOUBLE WOW!!!

A Real Life Story by Steven Matthews

A few weeks before Sept. 11th, my wife and I found out we were going to have our first child. She planned a trip out to California to visit her sister. On our way to the airport, we prayed that God would grant my wife a safe trip and be with her. Shortly after I said 'amen,' we both heard a loud pop and the car shook violently. We had blown out a tire.

I replaced the tire as quickly as I could, but we still missed her flight. We both were very upset as we drove home.

Later that morning I received a call from my father who was retired from the New York Fire Department (NYFD). He asked what my wife's flight number but I explained that we had missed the flight.

It was then my father informed me that her flight was the one that had crashed into the south tower. I was too shocked to speak. My father also had more news for me; he was going into the city to help. "This is not something I can't just sit by for; I have to do something."

I was concerned for his safety, of course, but more because he had never given his life to Christ. After a brief debate, I knew his mind was made up. Before he got off of the phone, he said, "take good care of my grandchild." Those were the last words I ever heard my father say; he died while helping in the rescue effort.

My joy that my prayer of safety for my wife had been answered quickly became anger. I was angry at God, at my father, and at myself. I had gone for nearly two years blaming God for taking my father away. My son would never know his grandfather, my father had never accepted Christ, and I never got to say good-bye.

Then something happened. About two months ago, I was sitting at home with my wife and my son, when there was a knock at the door. I looked at my wife but I could tell she wasn't expecting anyone. I opened the door to a couple with a small child.

The man looked at me and asked if my father's name was Jake Matthews. I told him it was. He quickly grabbed my hand and said, "I never got the chance to meet your father, but it is an honor to meet his son."

He explained to me that his wife had worked in the World Trade Center and had been caught inside after the attack. She was pregnant and had been caught under debris. He then explained that my father had been the one to find his wife and free her. My eyes welled up with tears as I thought of my father giving his life for people like this. He then said, "There is something else you need to know."

His wife then told me that as my father worked to free her she talked to him and led him to Christ. I began sobbing at the news.

Now I know that when I get to Heaven, my father will be standing beside Jesus to welcome me, and that this family would be able to thank him themselves.

When their baby boy was born they name him Jacob Matthew in honor of the man who gave his life so that a mother and baby could live.

The story should help us realize this: GOD IS ALWAYS IN CONTROL.

We may not see the reason behind things, and we may never know on this side of heaven, but God is ALWAYS in control.

Please take the time to share this amazing story. You may never know the impact that it may have on someone. God doesn't call the qualified, He qualifies the called.

GIVE THANKS TO THE LORD FOR HE IS GOOD. HIS LOVES ENDURES FOREVER. Psalm 136.
