Find us on Facebook

Via de Cristo of Ohio is now on Facebook!

One of my top priorities over the next several months is to bring Via de Cristo of Ohio into the 21st century with an updated web site and presence in social media. While our current web site is under construction, I launched our official Facebook Page on May 26, and after just 1 week we obtained over 70 likes. If you're on Facebook, please "like" our page and stay connected with upcoming events, prayer requests, and announcements.

Please be advised that our new Facebook Page is different from the "Via de Cristo Ohio Group" to which many already belong. So, what's the difference between a Facebook Page and a Facebook Group?

A Facebook Page is the authentic personal profile of an organization, business, public figure, etc. Pages can only be created by authorized representatives of the company the Page represents. A Page is the Company's way to communicate official business with the Facebook universe and is visible to everyone. Posts from a Facebook Page appear in the News Feed of the person who likes a particular Page.

On the contrary, a Facebook Group can be created by anyone (known as the Administrator) and is usually only open to a select group of people with a common interest. Individuals may join a Group either by invitation or by a request to the Administrator or his/her delegates. A Group allows for discussion among members, and the views and opinions shared in it are not necessarily those of the company, organization, product, service, person around which it is organized. Groups can either be "private" (meaning that the group cannot be found in a Facebook search, and discussions are not seen by those outside the group) but can also be "public" or open to anyone (the current Via de Cristo Ohio group is an Open group). Group members receive Notifications when someone posts on the Group page, but posts do not appear in one's News Feed.

SO WHAT HAPPENED ON THE KAIROS WEEKEND?

A few weeks ago, I had posted requests for prayer, cookies and money for Kairos #40 at the Ohio Reformatory for Women. Have you wondered what happened? Was the Lord there? Were the cookies blessed and enjoyed? Was it worth all the work and money? This is to give you just a little glimpse at what went on. I would LOVE to tell you ALL about it, but you wouldn't read the 200 pages it would take.

At Kairos, participants are seated at tables of nine, three volunteers (two lay, one clergy), and six residents. In these table families, most of the weekend takes place. We hear talks and meditations, share, visit the chapel, laugh, cry, grow together, and become a true family in the Lord. No one is left out. If special medications are needed, other reasons for the residents to be away, the weekend waits till the residents return. The families are assigned Friday morning, and we were the Family of Elizabeth. Our six resident participants were various ages from early 20s to middle 50s, with varied experiences and issues. Because of some technical glitches in our schedule early on, we had an opportunity to grow together early. By Saturday we were dealing with fear, rejection, guilt, anger, anxiety for families, self-protection and isolation, self-pity, and other things for which a sense of security is needed for discussion--serious things that can sometimes be reduced by sharing, but which seldom are in a prison environment. Midmorning Saturday, one of our participants (call her Susan because that isn't her name) was informed that she had a totally unexpected visit from her children. Susan had not seen them in over 15 months! However, if she left Kairos to take the visit, she would not be able to return! She was on the horns of a dilemma, because Kairos had a waiting list of over 400 for the 42 positions available, and she would not be permitted to return to the weekend! But what mother could reject that one chance to see her children? She chose, and went to the Visiting Hall.

The Family of Elizabeth had developed a bond, was devastated and everyone was heartbroken for Susan. We prayed, and together, volunteers and residents, we asked that the Lord would overcome the regulations and keep the family intact. All nine of us prayed. We hoped, but NEVER in the 20 years of Kairos at ORW had a participant who left been allowed to return!

Then there were <u>more</u> technical things going wrong with the schedule--special medications, delayed count times, and too many others to describe. After a few hours, Susan returned. The Chaplain asked what she had missed. It turned out she had NOT missed ANY of the talks, because the schedule was so badly impacted with delays! The miracle happened.... Susan was allowed to return! There were nine crying ladies at the Family of Elizabeth.

Wait, though! The big miracle was NOT that Susan had been allowed to return. The big miracle was that six residents and three volunteers experienced ANSWERED PRAYER! One of the residents had NEVER believed prayer would be answered! She said so over and over and over again! All of them were awestruck at the Hand of God that was evident FOR THEM, TO THEM, and in response to their prayers! "For us? God did this for US?" one said. The Lord was there! The cookies were blessed and enjoyed! It was worth everything it took! Praise the Lord!
