A Message from our Spiritual Director

I want to say a big thank you for all of you who say "yes" to an invitation to be part of a Via de Cristo team. It is a big commitment in time and energy. A Message from VdC Ohio Music Advisor Jen Briner

"As the Deer", by Martin Nystrom, has a special place in any Via de Cristo Weekend. Based on Psalm 42, it brings images of longing for God and putting our total trust and purpose in Him.

Martin wrote this song in the summer of 1981 after traveling to Dallas, TX. Was he following God's leading? No, it was a girl! After she broke his heart he was "stuck" in a place of despair and suffering. Not able to purchase a ticket home at the time, he took a friend's advice and fasted. After 19 days of only water and the Holy Spirit, Martin sat down at the piano and read Psalm 42. This song that came out of despair and hopelessness has blessed and brought hope to people world-wide. God took away all Martin's distractions so that, through isolation, He might create a mighty work in him.

Through this, we can know that solitude is sometimes a valuable tool that can lead us to a sacred goal. So the next time you enjoy the silence and solitude on Thursday night during a VdC Weekend, pay attention to what God is doing in you at that moment!

Via de Cristo/Curcillo/Kairos Weekends around the USA

SUPPORTING PRISON MINISTRY! KAIROS #42 – OHIO REFORMATORY FOR WOMEN! April 9-12

"Whatsoever you have done to the least of these, you have done it unto Me." Jesus

Just like Via de Cristo, every Kairos weekend in prison is a unique experience! At ORW, God calls a specific group of women to serve as the team and then another specific group of prison residents to receive His blessings, placing them together for three days of growth, sharing and grace. Even if YOU are not on the team, YOU can be involved in Kairos #42! The team makes a financial commitment, sacrifices their time and puts great efforts into preparation. The Christian community at large can help with important tasks to help the weekend run smoothly and support the work of the team.

- 1) PRAY! Prayer is the oil that makes everything work. The work is the work of the Lord, and He has ASKED for your prayers! There is a prayer vigil, and we ask each person who can to sign up for a specific time. Your first name and the date and time will also be written on a colored strip of paper. All the strips are pasted into a rainbow chain that goes all the way around the Conference Room... sometimes twice.
- 2) BAKE COOKIES! Each team member must collect 75 dozen cookies! If individuals make just THREE dozen each, it takes only 25 BAKERS to achieve that goal! Chocolate chip is the favorite, but "special" are used in the Conference Room. Rules: No powdered sugar or frosting. Pack them (cooled) one dozen to a QUART SIZED Ziploc bag (a new procedure). Pray while the cookies are baking that whoever receives the cookies also receives the Lord Jesus Christ! Deliver them to St. Andrews Anglican Church by Easter Sunday or call Donna Gough for pick-up.
- 3) MAKE A DONATION! It costs over \$150 for each prison resident to attend the weekend. Costs include Bibles, crosses, food for 3 days, paper supplies, Kleenex, posterboard, markers, rental of round tables, and much, much more. All funds are donated by Christians who love the Lord. NONE of the costs for Kairos weekends are from state funds! Even \$5.00 helps! Please make checks payable to "Kairos of Ohio", and write "ORW #42" in the memo line.
- 4) WRITE LETTERS TO THE PARTICIPANTS! Letters of encouragement are part of the process of sharing Jesus with the women. So many of them feel they have been "warehoused" and forgotten, that they are too discouraged to make a new life! YOUR note may make the difference. Please address to "Dear Sister in Christ", do NOT seal or write names on the envelope!
- 5) MAKE BANNERS OR POSTERS! Banners and posters are pinned all over the walls to show the love and support of the Christian community outside the razor wire. These are a witness, too, to those who come to visit the prison library, which is in the same building.
- 6) ATTEND THE CLOSING! Kairos #42 Closing is open to all Christians who are interested in seeing the outcome. Attendees are asked to be at the ORW Entrance Building by 4:00 PM on Sunday, April 12, at the Ohio Reformatory for Women. Application forms have address and instructions.

I am serving on this team, and ask your support for this work of the Lord. Applications for closing must be mailed in prior to Friday, April 3. All other items are needed by Easter Sunday!
