Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I have tried my best to build up the body of Christ know as Via de Cristo. I will admit - I am upset to say the least - even angry! Have you noticed that the list of Women's Pilgrims, 15 as of the end of April, has 11 of them being sponsored by team members? Of the 10 Pilgrims on the Men's Weekend, seven were sponsored by team members. I am grateful for all the work the team members have done but it is time to face the music. Where is the Community in helping us get Pilgrims? Weekends really do depend on the Community – not just for meals, serenade, palanca, prayer, etc., but for Pilgrims as well. Christ is counting on you and me – not just team members. Did you enjoy your weekend? Have you spoken with your pastor about the weekend? Have you spoken to family members and friends about the weekend? We need all of your help for these weekends to work! We also need people to attend Closings. If you discount people who worked the weekend and their families, Pilgrims and their families, I would bet there were no more than twenty other people at the men's Closing. Please try to attend the Send-off and the Closings, the Serenade (only men this time for the Women's Weekend), the Wake up – as much as you can. This truly shows Community to the pilgrims.

My challenge to the future Rectors is get new people involved. When you are asking people to team, if they have worked several weekends in a row, maybe it is time to give them a break and not ask them to team. While we all want to get

A LETTER from our NEW SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR

Greetings from your new Ohio Via de Cristo Spiritual Director, Pastor Lisa Peterson

Many who receive this newsletter will not know me, so by way of introduction, let me say I did Ohio Women's Weekend #53, where I sat at the table of Abigail. I live in Marblehead, Ohio with my husband Dan and our black Labrador retriever, Reina (Spanish for "queen"). We have four children, seven grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. Being a "newby" allows me to beg your indulgence as I "settle in" to this new role, which I view as a privilege as well as a challenge.

"Christ above me; Christ beside me; Christ before me; Christ to guide me." (Attributed to St. Francis of Assisi.)

None of us, perhaps, sees clearly where this life's path may lead him or her. Our dreams and ambitions may come to fruition along a smooth path, or something may intervene to adjust or change them. We may have occasion to call all our adaptive powers to the fore as we meet some "rocky road". We may even get stopped in our tracks by an unexpected and unwelcome obstacle.

One of the strangest pieces of path in my life was in Tanzania, on my third mission trip there. I was asked to officiate at a wedding of two young people in their village. I was thrilled to accept this gracious request, and with Francisco, my interpreter, the District Pastor, and my husband, Dan, we piled into the District's enclosed Jeep and set out. We drove a long way on one dirt road, finally turning off at another dirt road and then into what can only be described as a field. The then-five-years of drought had left the whole area a field of unmown hay with here and there a low-growing shrub. The Jeep slowed, the terrain very bumpy. The thought crossed my mind that the heat of the vehicles might ignite the grasses.

It was then that two young men jumped out of our companion vehicle, ran ahead of us, and started chopping the shrubbery to make a lane for the Jeeps to get through, using machetes they had brought along. To my Western eyes, there was nothing ahead of us for half a mile, at least. When we came to a stop, though, the villagers were there to greet us, with smiles so big it made me feel like a celebrity. I was certainly an oddity --- the first white person to ever visit their village.

The ceremony was held in their church building --- a stick structure held together with sisal twine (native grown), and covered with a grass-mat roof. There was one doorway opposite the single window. A low table for the candle and Holy Bible was the only "manufactured" piece. Besides this, there were four or five hand-hewn planks set across tree stumps for seating. It accommodated about 12 altogether, and the rest of the wedding guests stood outside the door.

A strange path. I could not have foreseen it. I could do nothing to make it easier; others had to clear the way. The only clear thing in the whole picture was that God had a plan for the life of this couple, and their life together began that day. In fact, they met one another just before the wedding. Two shy, optimistic young people --- 16 and 17 years old, joined by God's plan after their loving parents had agreed this would be "a good match". They had been baptized, and they trusted God's grace for their future. It was I who received the greatest blessing that day.

I've never known Ohio Via de Cristo without her. Even she says that she was "born and bred Via de Cristo." Her earliest memory of VdC was when she was just 7. It was the closing of her father's pilgrim weekend and she stood in the Fellowship hall of Grace Lutheran Church, Westerville, looking down at her father through the glass windows. Ohio Via de Cristo wishes Godspeed to Katrina (Pochard) Bruns as she and her family have moved to a little town in upstate New York just across the border from Ottawa, Canada.

Katrina, daughter of Tony (OH Men's VdC # 20) and Judy (OH Women's VdC #13) Pochard, literally grew up in the Via de Cristo community. She attended send-offs, closings, and serenades long before she attended her pilgrim weekend in the Spring of 2001 (OH Women's VdC # 42). Since that day, Katrina has faithfully served on 9 different teams in almost every role, culminating her service as Rector of Ohio Women's Via de Cristo #70 in November 2010.

Meeting her husband was definitely an act of faith as well. Having recently gone through a lousy break-up at the time, Katrina met Billy Bruns on MySpace. Hitting it off almost immediately, they were engaged after just 9 weeks of dating and were married on August 4, 2007, exactly 365 days to the date of first meeting (which just happened to be Judy's birthday as well). They welcomed their first child, Matthew Grayson, into the world on November 28 this past year.

Billy, a licensed Nazarene Minister, is finishing his Bachelor's in Biblical Studies at Indiana Wesleyan University, accepted the position of Senior Pastor at Norfolk Wesleyan Church in Norfolk, NY, where they are living above the church in a parsonage that is actually bigger than their former house in Trenton, OH. Katrina says that although Norfolk (pronounced "nor-fork") is small (population of just 1,300), the Damascus Road Via de Cristo community in the area is very active and she hopes to get plugged in soon.

For Katrina, this move was a "coming home" of sorts. She was born less than 200 miles south of Norfolk in Sarasota Springs, where the Pochards lived until 1984 when they moved to N. Charleston SC where Tony was stationed in the Navy. While Tony was on a long sea duty, Judy and Katrina moved to Hamilton, OH in the spring of 1987.

Once in Hamilton, Judy started attending Trinity Lutheran Church in Mt Healthy, where Rev. Tim Kuenzli introduced the family to this organization we call Via de Cristo. The rest, you could say, is history, and the Pochards have since become one of our most active VdC families serving on over 40 combined teams. One of Judy's proudest memories of Via de Cristo is when 3 Pochard women (Tony's mother "Archie" Pochard attended OH Women's VdC #38) were able to attend one weekend together. And although she has yet to attend a weekend, Katrina's younger sister, Kimberly (a senior in high school), can be seen at her fair share of Via de Cristo events as well.

When I asked Katrina recently about her favorite Via de Cristo moment, it's no surprise that it's from her first team experience. She shared how she and a few other teammates, who shall remain nameless so as to not incriminate anyone, thought it would be fun to hoist the Rectora's mattress on top of the refrigerator that was then stored in the Palanca room. Little did they realize that this little act they did early in the day would not be appreciated very well by the very tired Rectora at the end of what turned out to be a stressful day when she went to turn in for the night. I, for one, will miss these little antics as I had the privilege to serve with Katrina on 5 different teams and pray that someday we will get that chance again.
