Kairos Weekend Coming

We are blessed with another opportunity to support the Kairos Prison Ministry with prayers, letters, cookies and financial resources. Kairos #45 will take place October 27-30 at the Ohio Reformatory for Women, and two Via de Cristo women are on the team.... Donna Gough and Mary Ervin. 42 residents of the prison will be blessed for three days to share, eat, and hear about Jesus! Anyone in Christian community can help follow Jesus' words, "Inasmuch as you have done it unto the least of these, you have done it unto Me!" Here's how:

- 1) Prayers are needed! Prayer is the "oil" that keeps Kairos going just as it does for Via de Cristo. There is an 80-hour prayer vigil. Just pick your time and send an e-mail to either Donna or Mary. These names will be "linked" in a beautiful chain of prayer on the weekend.
- 2) Cookies! Home baked, and prayed for, packed one dozen each in quart size ziplock bags. Mostly chocolate chip are needed, because everyone in the institution gets a bag. Other kinds (peanut butter, snickerdoodles, oatmeal) will be served to the weekend participants during the weekend. Please, no powdered sugar or sprinkles! These are needed by Donna or Mary by October 26.
- 3) Money! It does not matter how much or how little! \$5.00 will buy a meal for an inmate! This is NOT paid for by the State, but by those who care that the message of Jesus Christ is carried to EVERYONE.
- 4) Letters! The same kind of letter that blessed YOUR weekend, just addressed "Dear Sister in Christ". Do not write on the envelope or seal it. Get them to Donna or Mary!
- 5) Banners, decorated placemats, posters! Show the love of Jesus to others! No glue, glitter, or stickers! Markers only.
- 6) Attend the closing on Sunday afternoon at the prison! You will have your socks blessed off! Applications for that need to be in by October 15, so call Donna Gough FAST with name, address, and Driver's License Number!
